Watch Making Natural Dye

This is a 'how to' video on how you can make natural dyes for fabric and yarn at home, using vegetables and spices. It is fairly simple, and hopefully you can use it to have a go yourself. This will be a task in the complete section.

Complete Create your own natural dyes

If possible, have a go at natural dying.
Try to follow the YouTube video. Hopefully, you can find the bits and pieces of natural fibre fabrics at home. For fabric you can recycle unwanted clothes, sheets. Cut the down into manageable samples. When finished iron your samples.
Some tips:

- Be careful of boiling water and wear gloves
- Think about colours and the palette you use in your work

Using the 'how to' guide linked below (there are lots more on YouTube if you want to explore), have a go at the ancient Japanese technique.

Perhaps use one of the vegetables dyes that worked successfully from the earlier 'Complete' task.

This is a fiddly technique and requires sewing. If you are not able to complete this, do a detailed drawing of an item of Ori nui Shibori from the V and A collection instead.
